The last two substantive reports for or by Manatū Taonga on the Carillon Bell Tower seismic work have been enclosed. For the purposes of this request, "for or by MCH" has been interpreted to include reports from companies externally contracted by Manatū Taonga to work on the Carillon Bell Tower project.

Please note that there have been minor redactions made to the Estimates Report noted above, to protect the privacy of natural persons under Section 9(2)(a) of the OIA. In this case, redactions have been applied to personal email addresses and phone numbers of the Quantity Surveyors and Project Manager contracted by Manatū Taonga. Minor redactions have also been made under Section 9(2)(b)(ii) which would be likely unreasonably to prejudice the commercial position of the person who supplied the information.

2. The latest two communications (briefings, memos) with any Minister or cabinet on Carillon seismic work.

The last two communications between Manatū Taonga and the Minister on the Carillon Bell Tower seismic work were updates included in the fortnightly Arts Culture and Heritage Status Reports on 19 April 2022 and 11 October 2021. These sections have been attached to this letter as an appendix (Appendix 1). A copy of structural engineer's report (which identifies the key seismic risks within the tower and provides the seismic strengthening options, all of which would strengthen the tower to 80 – 100% NBS).

Please also find enclosed the Concept Strengthening Report for the Carillon Tower at the National War Museum.
