

  - b. Please exclude any Ombudsman guidelines that are already publicly available.
- 2. Any additional information on how MCH makes decisions under the OIA when the information requested has a Māori or Te Tiriti o Waitangi aspect.
- 3. If and when any of the materials that fall within the scope of (1) or (2) are due to be reviewed.
